Tents

Made of thick breathable canvas materials to shut out direct sunlight and moderate room temperature. Simple design and easy to repair. (4m x 4m x 2m)



15,000
Blankets

Warm, durable and easy-to-dry fleece (polyester), made from recycled plastic bottles. (140cm x 200cm)



20,000
Water Containers

Lightweight, foldable and portable, made of durable polyethylene. (10-litre capacity)



6,000
Plastic Sheets

Highly versatile, can be laid on the ground or used for roofing. (4m x 5m)



15,000
Sleeping Mats

Three-layered foamed core material allowing for comfortable sleep even on hard surfaces. (185cm x 70cm)

Japan's Policies and Initiatives

Proactive Contribution to Peace

- Under the policy of Proactive Contribution to Peace based on the principle of international cooperation, Japan will contribute even more proactively in securing peace, stability and prosperity of the international community while achieving its own security as well as peace and stability in the Indo-Pacific region.
- Four staff officers of the Japan Self-Defense Forces are currently working in the headquarters of UNMISS.

Tokyo International Conference on African Development (TICAD)

- At the TICAD7 held in August 2019, Japan announced that it would support Africa's forward-looking initiatives toward peace and stability, which are preconditions for economic growth and investment as well as betterment of livelihood, through New Approach for Peace and Stability in Africa (NAPSA).
- As announced by Prime Minister Abe, NAPSA will attach importance to Africa's ownership in conflict prevention and mediation as well as address root causes hindering peace and stability in Africa through supporting institution-building.



Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)



- Japan intends to lead the promotion of the SDGs in the international community, building upon its strength in traditional wisdom, cutting-edge technologies and information as well as its conviction to leave no one behind, based on the concept of human security.

Humanitarian-Development-Peace Nexus

- Following assistance in the early stages of a conflict, Japan will seamlessly move into support for peace-building and conflict prevention as well as economic development and poverty eradication.
- Some examples of such assistance include support for disarmament, demobilization, and reintegration (DDR), development of legal and judicial systems, public safety and security, disposal of landmines and unexploded ordnance, and capacity building of peace-building actors.
